PREFATORY NOTE

The National Conference leaves the interpretation of the following statistics to the reader. One cautionary note, however, is in order.

The number of persons added to the ranks of the legal profession continues to be of special interest. When seeking to determine the increase or decrease in the number of those admitted to practice nationwide, the reader must keep in mind that one may seek admission to more than one jurisdiction in a given year.

To date, the National Conference has not made an attempt to determine the actual number of persons admitted to practice in the United States each year.

For example, in February 1974, four points were added to a raw score of 126 to result in a scaled score of 130. In February 1975, seven points were added to a raw score of 123 to result in a scaled score of 130.

Multistate Professional Responsibility Examination Statistics

The National Conference of Bar Examiners has administered the Multistate Professional Responsibility Examination (MPRE) since 1980. Thirty-seven jurisdictions are now participating jurisdictions.

The MPRE consists of fifty multiple-choice questions providing raw scores or number of correct answers on a range of 1 to 50. An adjustment is made in these scores for each form of the MPRE based on the difficulty of the particular form of the test. If a given test is easier than the base test, points are subtracted from the applicant's score. If a given test is more difficult than the base test, points are added to the applicant's raw score. The resulting scores are then converted to a range of scaled scores from 50 to 150.
